About Leh

Once the capital of the Himalayan kingdom of Ladakh, Leh district of Jammu and Kashmir is the second largest district in the country. Situated at an altitude of 3,524 metres (11,562 ft), Leh has a cold desert climate with long, harsh winters from October to early March, with minimum temperatures well below freezing for most of the winter. Topographically, the whole of the district is mountainous with three parallel ranges of the Himalayas, the Zaskar, the Ladakh and the Karakoram. Between these ranges, the Shayok, Indus and Zaskar rivers flow and most of the population lives in valleys of these rivers.

Leh is connected to the rest of India by two high-altitude roads: National Highway 1D from Srinagar via Kargil and Leh-Manali Highway. Leh Airport has flights to Delhi at least daily on Jet Airways and/or Indian Airlines and/or Air India.

Few tourist spots worth visiting in and around Leh are Leh Palace, Namgyal Tsemo Gumpa, Khardung La, Spituk Monastery, Hemis gumpa and Pangong Tso Lake.

About EJM College, Leh:

Eliezer Joldan Memorial College, Leh offers undergraduate courses in science and arts. The college was established in 2003. Students from Ladakh, in their lust to pursue higher academic programmes, even today, disperse to various universities and technological institutions in the country.
